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old folder still. How can I move the contents of the .old folder to a new partition, leaving the old partition in tact? A: You can use copy/move to the new partition, and then remove the old one. The same thing is possible with the Win7 Admin tools, but you must choose a new drive and a new drive letter. This is because when you remove a partition, the old drive letter and drive is gone. From a batch file, use the following line to put all files to the new partition, and then remove the old partition: robocopy.exe \\server\share path newpartition /e /move If you use a more powerful Windows tool for this, you can use the GUI. Now, to remove the old partition: diskpart select disk 0 list disk select disk 1 list partition select partition 1 delete partition partition 1 is your old partition, and you can also use diskpart to add a new partition, if desired. This process will take a few hours depending on the size of the original disk, and it will take more time the more partitions you have. If you're on a current Windows 10 installation, then the experience is a lot better. If you're on Windows 7 or Windows 8.1, you'll want to start a command line session and enter these commands: attrib -s -h -r -s C:\Users\ame\AppData\Local\Temp\regedit.old attrib +s -h -r -s C:\Users\ame\AppData\Local\Temp\regedit.new As always, make sure you back up your data.
